POPULATION: Women, men, HIV-positive, patients

RESPONSE OPTIONS: Number of times

SCORING: Less than 95% adherent = nonadherent

SURVEY ITEMS: "During the last 7 days, how many times, in total, did you take one or more of your antiretroviral pills more than two hours late?"

RELIABILITY INFORMATION: No reliability information reported.

VALIDITY INFORMATION: Criterion-related validity assessed via comparison with viral load.
