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## **Questionnaire Items**

- 1. Verbally threatens to hurt partner
- 2. Threatens with gestures (e.g., staring)
- 3. Harms or threatens to harm someone partner cares about
- 4. Harms, or threatens to harm, pets
- 5. Attempts to control who partner spends time with
- 6. Tries to restrict partner's movements
- 7. Keeps partner from leaving (e.g., stand in front of doorway)
- 8. Withholds car keys, disables vehicle
- 9. Accuses partner of being unfaithful or flirting with others
- 10. Secretly records partner
- 11. Searches partner's purse/wallet/cell phone calls
- 12. Interrogates partner as to where he/she has been, who he/she has seen
- 13. Controls the money and excludes partner from financial decisions
- 14. Spends money excessively or lies about expenses
- 15. Refuses to work or contribute financially
- 16. Withholds child support
- 17. Demands unreasonable child support or lies to get more of it
- 18. Threatens to have partner fired
- 19. Tells partner he/she is unattractive
- 20. Flirts with others to make partner jealous
- 21. Threatens to or actually has an affair
- 22. Calls partner names (e.g., Bitch, Loser)
- 23. Makes fun of partner's sexual performance
- 24. Humiliates in front of others
- 25. Pressures partner to do things against his/her values
- 26. Ridicules partner
- 27. Treats partner like he/she is stupid
- 28. Tells partner he/she is incompetent and helpless
- 29. Tells partner what he/she cares about is unimportant
- 30. Spreads false rumors about partner
- 31. Tells others partner is crazy
- 32. Blames partner for all the problems in the relationship
- 33. Orders partner around
- 34. Expects partner to "hop to it"
- 35. Nags
- 36. Refuses to accept "No" for an answer
- 37. Criticizes partner's every move
- 38. Insists on talking late at night keeping partner awake
- 39. Calls or goes to partner's place of work to harass him/her
- 40. Makes false statements about partner to employer/coworkers
- 41. Follows partner around
- 42. Calls, pages, or text messages constantly
- 43. Leaves numerous unwanted messages on partner's voice mail or computer
- 44. Threatens self-harm to get my attention

- 45. Deliberately ignores partner
- 46. Withholds affection or sex
- 47. Locks partner out of bedroom or residence when angry
- 48. Refuses to cooperate
- 49. "Forgets" important things (e.g., to pay bills or relay calls/messages
- 50. Tells children negative things about partner
- 51. Uses children as spies
- 52. Excludes partner from child rearing decisions
- 53. Recruits the children against partner
- 54. Threatens to take the children
- 55. Keeps children from partner
- 56. Refuses to allow the children to see partner's parents/extended family
- 57. Files or threatens false/exaggerated domestic violence charges
- 58. Files or threatens false/exaggerated child abuse charges
- 59. Threatens to have partner deported
- 60. Reports or threatens to report partner to welfare
- 61. Pressures partner to have sex when he/she doesn't want to
- 62. Pressures partner to engage in unwanted sexual practices
