POPULATION: Women, patients

RESPONSE OPTIONS: Patients responded to each of these items with a 5-point frequency format: never, rarely, sometimes, fairly often, and frequently.

SCORING: Total score values could range from a minimum of 4 to a maximum of 20.

SURVEY ITEMS: "How often does your partner: physically hurt you, insult you or talk down to you, threaten you with harm, and scream or curse at you?"

RELIABILITY INFORMATION: Cronbach's α=0.80

VALIDITY INFORMATION: Content validity and criterion validity were assessed. The Conflict Tactics Scale (CTS) was the criterion measure used.
