RELIABILITY INFORMATION: Cronbach's α = 0.92 (Italian Sample) and 0.89 (Canadian Sample)

VALIDITY INFORMATION: Convergent validity and criterion validity were assessed. The Italian and Canadian samples were compared for the criterion measure. Factor structure was tested and results revealed a two-factor solution.
